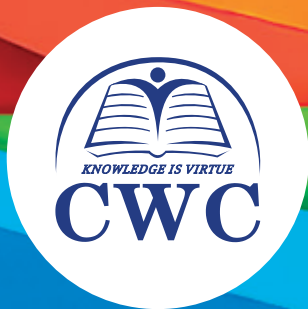

Yoga Day – (Breathe, Stretch and Go) Jr. KG & Sr. KG

The Yoga Day activity was conducted by Yoga Guru Sagarji to encourage flexibility and body awareness, while promoting calmness, focus, and emotional regulation. Students performed simple, age-appropriate asanas accompanied by soothing music.



Rainbow Colour Hunt Jr. KG & Sr. KG

This activity helped in strengthening colour recognition and enhancing students' observation skills. Children arranged seven coloured rings one by one in the correct sequence, representing the seven colours of the rainbow (VIBGYOR). The task not only reinforced their understanding of colour order but also encouraged concentration, coordination, and joyful learning through hands-on experience.

Seed Frenzy Jr. KG & Sr. KG

This activity helped students develop love and care for nature by understanding how seeds germinate and plants grow. They practically planted seeds in plastic pots filled with mud and manure, watered them, placed them in sunlight, and observed them daily. Over time, they watched the seed sprout, grow into a sapling, and eventually develop into a small plant, giving them a hands-on experience of the life cycle of a plant.



Perfect Pair Drops

Sr. KG

Students developed logical thinking and memory skills as they identified relationships between objects such as a cup and saucer, book and paper, or sock and shoe. These items were scattered on a mat, and students were asked to pick an object placed in front of them and match it with its corresponding pair. This hands-on activity strengthened their categorization abilities and enhanced their understanding of object associations.



Math Beat

Sr. KG

This activity integrated rhythm, number recognition, counting, number sense, and number grouping. Number cards were placed inside a hula hoop on the floor, while coloured balls were kept in a box at a distance. Students had to pick a number card, recognise the number, then go to the box and collect the exact number of balls. They then placed the balls inside the hula hoop. This engaging activity strengthened numerical understanding through movement, coordination, and hands-on learning.



Shape A Bot

Sr. KG

Objective: This activity encouraged creativity and imagination using basic shapes while enhancing fine motor skills. Students were given different shape cut-outs made of cardboard and covered with aluminium foil. They were asked to pick the appropriate shapes, place them correctly, and arrange them to form a shape robot. This hands-on task strengthened shape recognition, spatial awareness, and artistic expression.



Independence Day Celebration

Jr. KG & Sr. KG

The students enjoyed waving the National Tricolour to the beats of patriotic couplets being played. Later, the teachers explained the national symbols and the importance of celebrating national festivals. The celebration instilled a sense of patriotism and national pride, while also encouraging respect and appreciation for cultural values.



Honouring the Generation of Love (Flower Making for Grandparents)

The aim of this activity was to enhance creativity and fine motor skills as students crafted flowers of different colours and coloured handmade thank-you cards for their grandparents. This thoughtful activity allowed children to express their love and appreciation, strengthening their emotional connection with their elders.

Get Ready and Dazzle (Fancy Dress Competition)

Jr. KG & Sr. KG

This fun-filled activity aimed to encourage imaginative thinking, build confidence, develop communication skills, and enhance understanding of various roles based on the given themes—Jr KG: Cartoon Characters and Sr KG: Community Helpers. Students participated with great enthusiasm, dressed according to their themes, and confidently spoke a few lines about the characters they were portraying.



Trunk Toss Challenge

Jr. KG

This activity enhanced hand-eye coordination and aiming skills through fun and engaging play. Students aimed seven different colourful rings, tossing them one by one into a basket placed at a distance—without allowing a single ring to fall out. This enjoyable task promoted focus, precision, and controlled movement



Around the Sun We Go (Solar System Activity)

Jr. KG & Sr. KG

This activity encouraged curiosity, teamwork, and conceptual learning through a role-play demonstration of how planets revolve around the Sun in their orbits. One student stood at the centre of a circular table holding a thermocol cut-out of the Sun, while eight other students, each holding a pictorial planet name chart, walked around in a circle one after the other according to the correct planetary order. The teachers provided detailed explanations about the planets and their movements, making the activity both engaging and educational.



Palindromes

The Palindromes activity was conducted to help students recognise and form words or numbers that read the same backward and forward. Students were given a fun and educational worksheet to identify or create such words or numbers that remain unchanged when reversed.

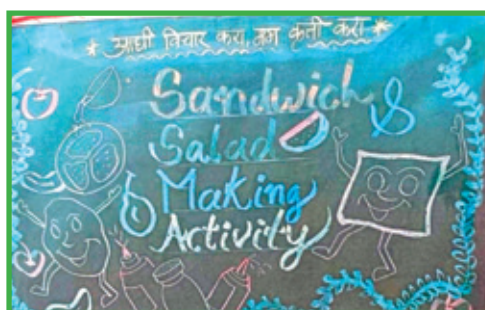


Culinary Export Activity

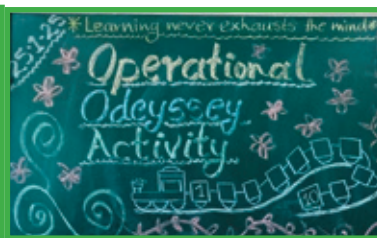
Sandwich and Salad Making Activity

- Day 5 – Reflections in Words (Report Writing)

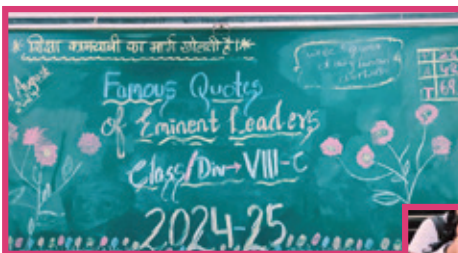
INVESTITURE CEREMONY / PTA FELICITATION

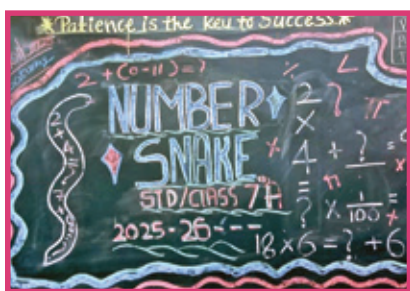
FOLKLORE DANCE

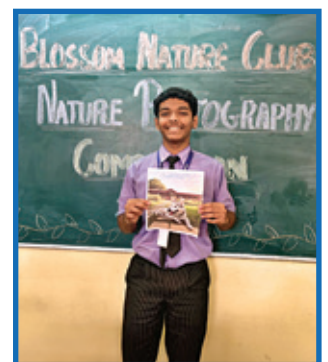


Visit to Bhavans Nature Park

- Promoted gender sensitization and encouraged participants to challenge gender stereotypes.



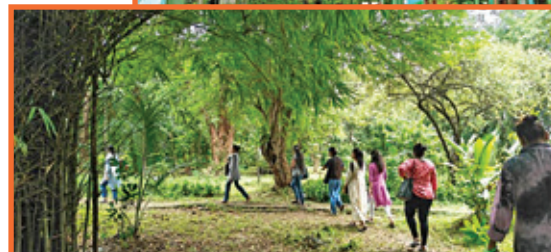


Farewell to the Senior Batch 2022–24

- Individual guidance was also offered to help participants strengthen specific subjects or topics where they needed additional support.

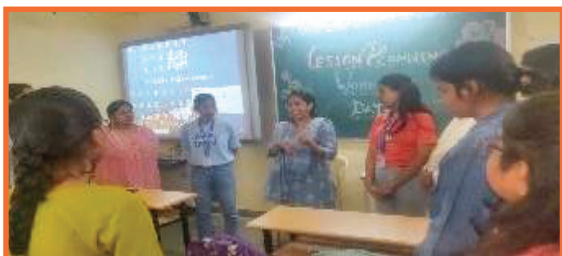


Peace Education Certificate Course – Prem Rawat Foundation

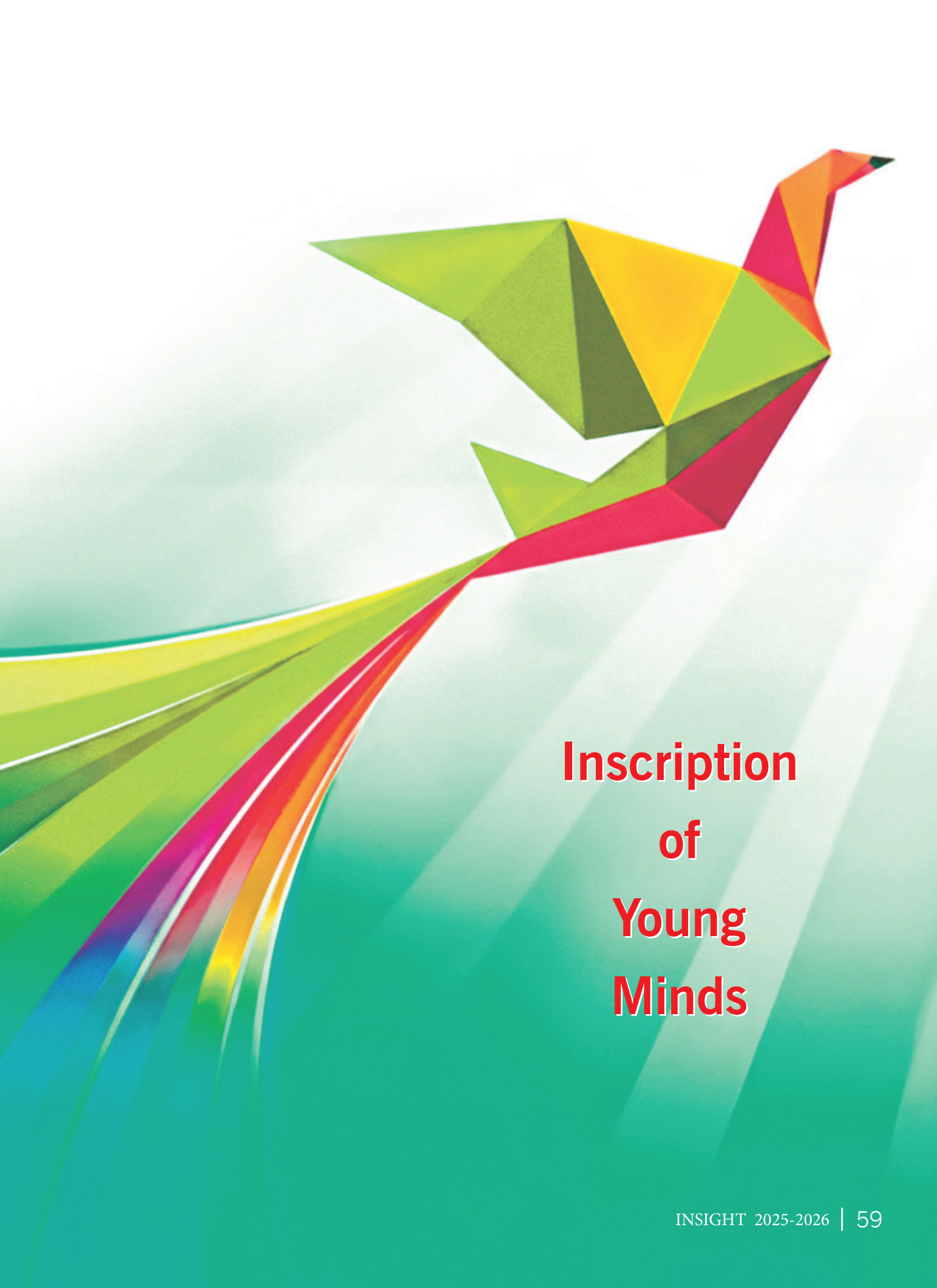

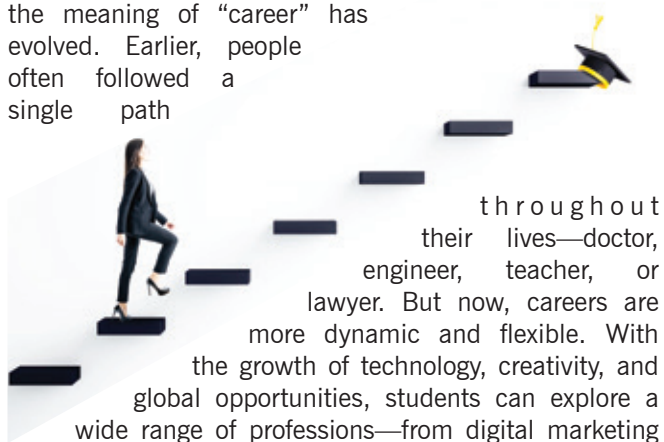

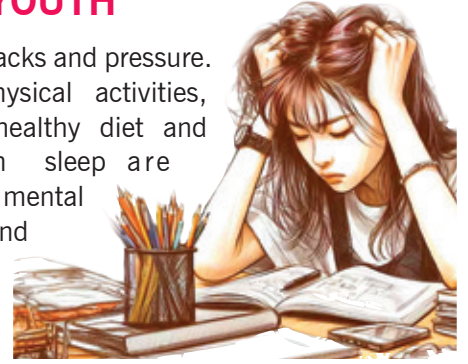
However, stress can be managed if tackled properly. A good time management and planning can help reduce last-

- * Seek help: Many institutions have specific anti-ragging help lines and support systems for students.

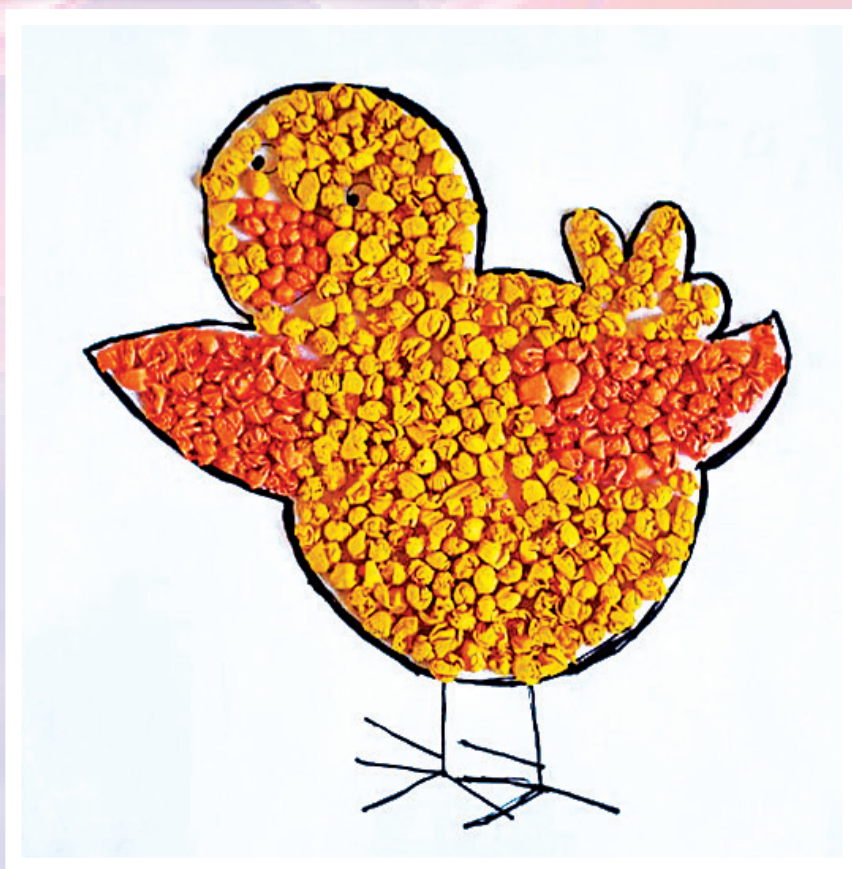


- * Know the law: Be aware of the anti-ragging laws and regulations in your country, as they can help in taking legal action.

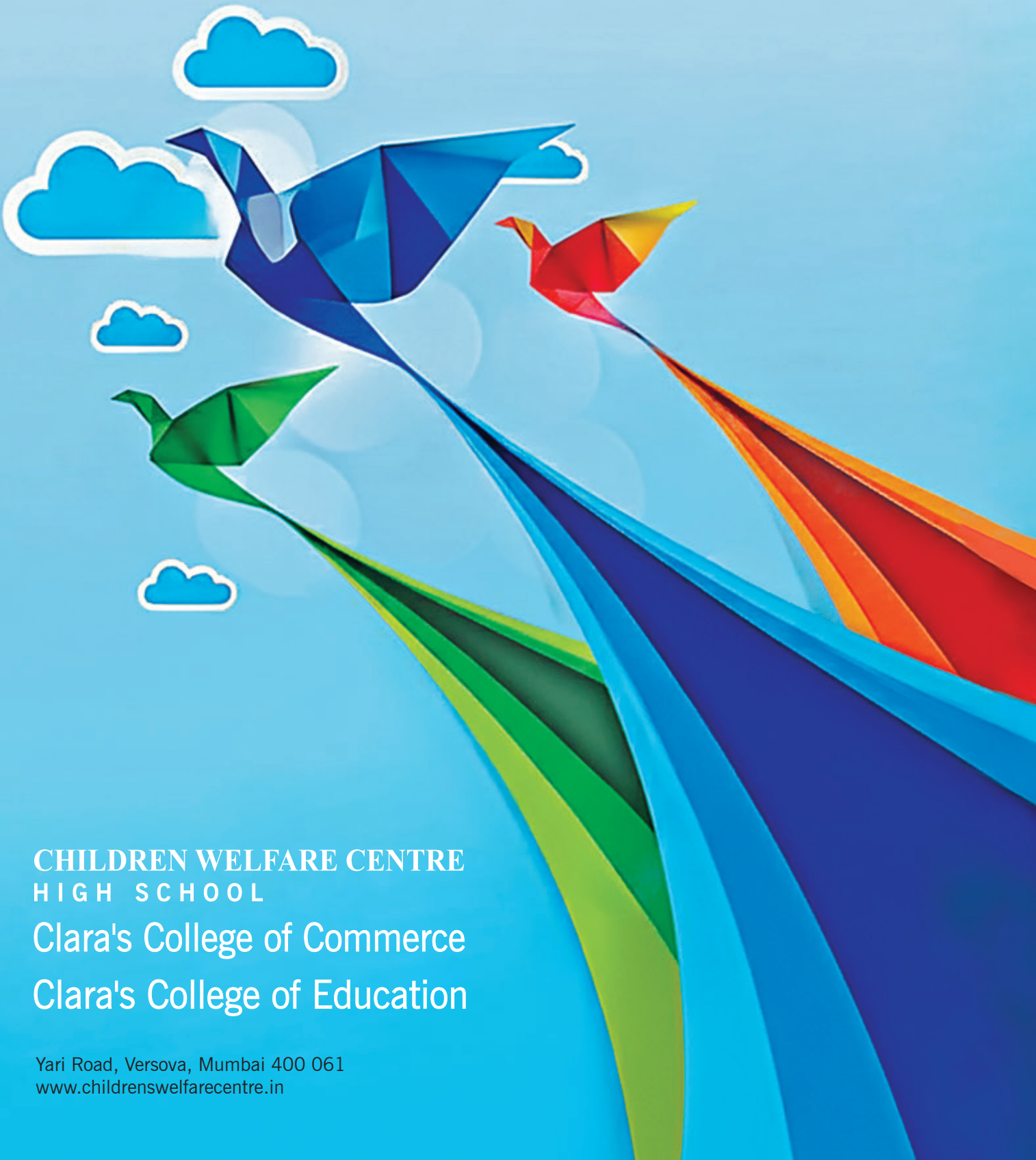
